



Our Students

St. Aloysius' College is a mixed sixth form. Our students mainly reside in Islington but we openly accept students from many other London Boroughs.



Dress Code

There is no uniform in our Sixth Form but students are expected to dress appropriately for a school environment.

Morning registration is at 8.45am - 9.00am.

The Year 13 students use this time in the morning to meet their personal tutors and discuss their post-18 choices, whether it is about the application to university, apprenticeships or any other choices. Year 12 students are also allocated personal meeting times in the second and third term to discuss their transition into A Level and their post-18 choices.

At break and lunchtime Sixth Form students enjoy socialising in their own Sixth Form area.

The Sixth Form Block

The Common Room is open all day every day and is only for Sixth Form students.



There is a private study area situated next to the Common Room with access to computers for silent study. The Study Room is also open all day every day.



Financial Support for Students

St. Aloysius' bursary:

A generous bursary is issued at the end of each term; Assessment Point grades, punctuality and attendance are all qualifiers for bursary funding. The bursary is paid by cheque directly to students.

Islington resident's bursary:

We offer an Islington resident's bursary which is available for all Islington residents eligible for the pupil premium.

Monitoring of Progress

- Parents' Evenings for Year 12s and 13s: The teacher-parentstudent meetings offer the opportunity to discuss progress and targets with all involved, and students receive valuable feedback. These evenings are always very well attended.
- **The Sixth Form Team** review and monitor the grades of each student after each Assessment Point. Parental meetings take place if necessary for the interest of the young person.
- **Reports** are sent home three times a year after each Assessment Point, and give clear feedback on current level, predictions, homework/classwork assessment, attendance and punctuality.



Moving on ... University, Apprenticeship, Employment or gap year support

In Year 12, students can start to plan what they wish to do thanks to personalised discussions with their teachers, their Tutors and the Head of Sixth Form. They have help in deciding on the path they wish to choose, whether it be to continue their studies at University, to apply for an apprenticeship or to go to into paid work.

Whatever their choice, every student is listened to, advised and supported throughout the process.

1. Applying for University:

For students wishing to go to university, we provide access to daily support by fully qualified and trained members of staff. Their role is to monitor each student's UCAS application and provide them with the right advice and guidance for completion.

Students are trained to use *Unifrog*, a university search tool which enables them to have access to detailed information about all the courses and all the universities in the UK.

Students will benefit from:

- (1) Numerous UCAS sessions based in the Sixth Form.
- (2) A UCAS/Post 18 Choices Week focussing on finding out what going to university means and involves, finances and Unifrog and other post 18 opportunities.
- (3) Personalised UCAS support members of staff, with one-to-one regular and frequent sessions.

2. Applying for an Apprenticeship:

The students who are interested in doing an apprenticeship are emailed regularly with opportunities. We also invite in specialists to run sessions in which students are provided with all the information and tools they need to be successful in getting an apprenticeship in their field of interest.

3. Planning a useful gap year and preparing for work:

We have worked closely for a few years now with '*The Challenge*', an organisation that provides a high quality 12-month work placement with professional development to boost employability.

4. Employment

Sessions are organised every year with professionals from all different types of organisations. The workshops tackle personal statement writing, interview skills, self-presentation and what employers look for in a young person.





Destinations

The vast majority of our students succeed in going to the University of their Choice.
